AFRICA DAY

The Herschel Prep celebration of Africa Day began with a Green Assembly led by the Guppies for God group. The girls shared about trees in the Bible and two amazing examples of how Africa is making a difference to climate change through the planting of trees. The first was the wonderful example of Wangari Maathai's life and her Green Belt Movement in Kenya who have planted over 51 million trees. The second was the Great Green Wall of the Sahara and the Sahel which is a project led by the African Union. It is being used to hold back expansion of the Sahara, by planting a wall of trees stretching across the entire Sahel. It involves countries from Senegal in the West to Djibouti in the East and is 8 000 km long.

On Wednesday, 25 May, the girls were busy with many different activities. The senior grades started with an Africa General Knowledge Quiz and then listened to an interesting talk about trees by Francois Krige. He explained about the trees around our school in the Arderne Gardens.

The Foundation Phase girls were all aboard the Shosholoza train with Khaya Mpinda, who taught them the art of gum boot dancing.


Delicious vetkoek and ginger beer were available for the girls at break time. The senior grades rotated through four different activity stations. The activities were: beading a bracelet in the colours of the SA flag; Gumboot dancing; building the African continent puzzle and creating a mosaic African Woman.

The Foundation Phase enjoyed listening to an African folktale around the campfire performed by Mrs Moritz, Mrs Davids, Mrs Kebeni and Ms van der Vyver – African instruments were added for an authentic feel whilst the lights were dimmed, and the blinds drawn so that girls could be fully invested in the moment. They also enjoyed iPad activities where they learnt the map of Africa in a puzzle as well as many interesting facts about our beautifully diverse continent. The girls made African inspired necklaces to adorn their uniforms for the day.


