Pre-Prep



What is interesting is that on our Herschel bird outing to Rondevlei last year many girls saw the beautiful Greater Painted Snipe. It is a very shy bird and is seldom seen in the South Western Cape. It is still there and many of the birders involved in the challenge are rushing to Rondevlei to see it! But the members of the Cape Bird Club, together with our Herschel girls, were the first to alert everyone to its presence.




Chess Club

Parking and Traffic

As it is the beginning of the year I thought it would be an appropriate time to remind parents of our efforts to lessen traffic congestion in Kenmar Road. The way we use this road affects us all and so cooperation by the whole Herschel family needs to be a priority.

Whilst we depend ultimately on your patience while lifting your children, we do however need to follow some basic rules and show the appropriate respect to our neighbours and the public. We have consequently created traffic rules which are pertinent to Herschel parents ONLY. This includes using Kenmar Road as a one-way during peak periods in the direction of Highwick Road. (Please remember that this is a Herschel request to our parents and that we do not have the authority to prescribe road usage to residents and the broader public.) If your child is not ready to be fetched, you should do the full circle and re-enter Kenmar as this will maintain traffic flow.

A further request is that parents do NOT park on the opposite side of the parking embayment outside the tennis courts and Music School as this narrows the road and prevents traffic flow in the area. Moreover, this is illegal as it is not a One Way for the general public. The One Way is meant to be in the one lane only and not a double carriage way. Again, we request that you are also mindful of our neighbours and treat them with respect and do NOT park across their driveways or obstruct them in any way. The traffic department has also been made aware of the misuse by parents.

We know that we will never eliminate traffic congestion, but we are sure that with your support, we will definitely make it less frustrating. Our Security guards have been instructed to enforce these "rules" and I ask that you treat them with the respect and consideration that they deserve. After all they are doing this in your best interests! Our security staff therefore have every right to insist that you do not park on the wrong side of the road facing the wrong way. This is illegal and the broader public do not know of our own internal rules.

School starting times

Parents are reminded that the school day for girls in $Gr\ 1-7$ starts at 07:30. Please can we request that girls arrive at school timeously so that they can be in their classrooms by 07:30. This is essential so that they can unpack and the class teachers are able to connect with their classes, in order to be ready for the first academic lesson which begins promptly at 07:40.

We encourage all parents to read the handbook as it is a great tool to refer to from time to time during the school year.
