



Celebrating Africa Day - 25 May 2023

Two of the Grade 8 Elective classes, "Hello Africa! Tell Me How You're Doing" and "Travelling in Africa with Avi and Kumbi", worked on projects to display in the Atrium in celebration of Africa Day. Africa Day celebrates the formation of the Organisation of African Unity which later became the African Union. The aim of the project was to learn about the formation and purpose of the African Union. The task involved either researching people, projects or organisations in Africa working towards promoting democracy, peace or education, or to research culture, environment or resources in order to celebrate the richness and diversity on our continent.

Presentations of the projects included posters, models, baking and TikTok videos and animations. On the 25th of May the display was ready in the Atrium for pupils and teachers to learn from. The Baking Club also had a bake sale to raise funds for Ikhaya le Themba (a non-profit educational support organisation in Hout Bay) and some of the Elective pupils sold "South Africa cake" to raise funds for the Siya Kolisi Foundation. The display will be up until the 9th of June.







"A Journey Through Time to the Anthropocene" Pop-Up book project

The Grade 8 "Anthro" Elective class is busy working on their final project of the semester, the Pop-Up Book Project. Pupils can choose any topic that relates to the elective curriculum and research it to understand their topic well. This information is then communicated in a Pop-Up book, using predominantly visuals and popups to explain their research. The class is finding the project challenging and fun as they grapple with research skills, being creative and building pop-ups from card. Some of the topics chosen this semester include dinosaurs, climate change, extinction, space and continental drift. Keep an eye out for the finished projects later this term!







Shakespeare Schools Festival

On 24 May, Herschel Girls School (A Midsummer Night's Dream) shared the stage with Queens Park High School (Macbeth) and Victoria Park Primary (King Lear) at the 13th Shakespeare Schools Festival at the Star Theatre in District Six. Herschel has been an active member of the festival, having staged productions every year since its inception in 2012. The festival encourages our pupils and teachers to engage with conceptual thinking around how the ideas of the play can be translated into fresh and exciting choices around costume, set and theatre tech.

This year, we focused on bringing the fairy magic and fantasy of the play to life with glittering fairy lights, the use of colour and texture to identify the human and fairy worlds, wirework, physical theatre and dance — to the instrumental music of Billie Eilish, Lorde, Boo and the Nomads.

All hail to our Grade 8 and 9 pupils who ended the evening on a veritable high note! The play was an inclusive collaboration between the disciplines of Drama and Dance, with the actors delivering beautifully physical and comical performances. All actors who auditioned received roles: as important as it was to create a theatrical product of which we could be proud, the most important thing was to facilitate a space where our younger pupils could build their confidence, find their voice, make personal connections and thrive.

The teachers (Alexandra February, Sheldon Cross and Sarah McArthur) combined their creative strengths and worked together to bring out the best in the pupils and the text. We are so proud of our pupils for their incredible work!









Cultural Assembly and Eisteddfod Launch

We held our termly cultural assembly on the 23rd May. This term we focused on our junior performers in order to encourage participation, belonging and to establish their rightful place on our Herschel stage. The pupils delivered beautiful work which ranged from piano performance and contemporary singing to drama and dance. It was also a lovely opportunity to share snippets of performances from other concerts (Herschel Unplugged, Shakespeare Schools Festival) with the whole student and staff body.

We also launched our annual Eisteddfod, which will take place in the third term (8 August). The Eisteddfod gives our pupils a chance to spend the whole day performing and participating in a range of activities and disciplines. Staff set creative and exciting challenges and create opportunities for our pupils to take part in things they are passionate about. Pupils can try new things, get valuable feedback from internal and external professionals and celebrate and support the work of their peers. This year the categories are: Art, Dance, Design, Drama, Debating, Music, Photography, English, Afrikaans, isiXhosa and French. Entries for the Eisteddfod are done on the Herschel intranet. Entries close on 1 August.
