**Dear Parents and Pupils** 

What counts in life is not the mere fact that we have lived, it is what difference we have made to the lives of others that will determine the significance of the life we lead. (Nelson Mandela)

What a wonderful start we had to the term when we welcomed pupils back on 18th July, Mandela Day. The day started with House activities in which all pupils and staff came together, participating in a range of projects: making dog cushions (for DARG), sleeping bags (for The Service Dining room in Cape Town), Jars of Hope (to be donated to 'Where Rainbows Meet' in Vryegrond and 'Living hope' in Masiphumelele), and play dough and colouring-in books (for the St Joseph home in Montana). The projects were arranged towards the end of last term to ensure that we had all the materials required to complete and deliver on this special day of reflection, community-in-action and appreciation of the legacy of Nelson Mandela. Enjoy the photographs which capture the spirit and involvement of staff and pupils as they worked together towards completing their projects. It was a very special morning.

Collectively we spent 67 minutes working together towards making a difference, mindful of the spirit of Mandela and inspired by his legacy. Nelson Mandela fought for justice for 67 years of his life and by devoting 67 minutes of our time — one minute for every year of Mandela's public service — we can take a step towards a global movement for good.

The day was conceptualized to shine a light on the legacy of Mr Mandela whose commitment to human rights, conflict resolution and reconciliation stands as an example to us all.

Mandela Day is an international day of honour, servitude and remembrance, celebrated each year on 18 July, on Nelson Mandela's birthday. The day was officially declared by the UN in November 2009, with the first UN Mandela Day held on 18 July 2010. Since then, Mandela Day has encouraged a movement of people across the globe, seeing each person dedicate 67 minutes of their time to collectively make a difference. Of course, South Africans have a vested interest in leading this given the profound impact Mr Mandela has had here.

A good head and good heart are always a formidable combination (Nelson Mandela). What a wonderful mantra for this term. In assembly, through the teaching of Rev Lorna and in the welcome back message to the school, we focused on the importance of being real, being courageous; of having a bold vision, of knowing, sharing and living our values; of modelling courage and goodwill, of being more generous, less judgmental.

At the start of term we welcomed back Ms Liesl Juries, Ms Lindsay Wills and Mev Louise van Wyk, all of whom have been on maternity leave. With Mrs Candice Lacerda having emigrated to Canada at fairly short notice, we have been fortunate to have procured the services of Mrs Wendy Walter – well known to the

pupils as an experienced and passionate teacher of Science. Mrs Walter will teach Mrs Lacerda's classes until the end of this year.

We are delighted to have appointed Mrs Jeanne Trickett, a highly experienced IEB Science teacher as Subject Head of Science. She is relocating to Cape Town in January 2024, from Gauteng, where she has been teaching at St John's College, Houghton.

This week we also welcomed to Herschel a number of Exchange students who will be immersing themselves in life at Herschel. We wish them an enriching and funfilled experience at school, and in this beautiful city of Cape Town.

At Tuesday's assembly, we applauded the wonderful achievements on the part of our sportswomen this past holiday! We are super proud of their efforts and success. I hope that you have seen the social media posts celebrating their successes during the holidays.
