God has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end. (Ecclesiastes 3:11)



This helped them design closed and open questions. Some very interesting questions came from the discussion and the girls are ready to design their own driving question.

# Sustainability

#### World Wetland Day 2 February 2023

During Monday's assembly, the Herschel girls were privileged to listen to Kate Snaddon, a freshwater ecologist who does research on Wetlands and other natural freshwater systems. She spoke of the important role wetlands play in supplying fresh and clean water to the world. She emphasized that only 3% of the world's total water is fresh, as shown by the small blue dot on the map or low level of water in the jug. Wetlands supply food to many people as rice is grown in wetland and wetland paddies. Rice supplies food to more than 3 billion people. Wetlands are home to a myriad of plant and animal life. She ended by suggesting ways in which everyone can help protect wetlands: by picking up litter, using less "stuff" and by using soaps and cleaning agents that are environmentally friendly as these all too often find their way into our water systems.







#### Eco Warrior Badges

The girls can earn an Eco Warrior Badge by participating in School and Community Eco Events. The Eco girls receive a card on which to keep a record of the events they have attended. After attending four outings, your daughter will qualify for an Eco Warrior Badge. This is a school initiative which encourages the girls to enjoy the activities on offer. However, the fact that many families participate in community events is acknowledged and can contribute to one signature per badge level. A photograph of your child participating in this community event needs to be emailed to her class teacher or Mrs Roebert (<a href="mailto:mroebert@herschel.org.za">mroebert@herschel.org.za</a>). #### 11 February – 13 Peak Challenge – Devil's Peak re-take

The next hike is Devil's Peak on Saturday, 11 February. Starting point is the end of Tafelberg road, a few kilometres past the cable station, at the sign that says Devil's Peak on the right-hand side. This point is labelled as "Devi'ls Peak hike start" on Google maps. Please get there at 06:45 to start walking at 07:00 sharp. This hike is not technical, but it is hard work- there is a big ascent followed by a big descent with no flat in between. There's no shade and no water, and it can be very exposed at the top. This will be our second attempt to summit- last time a howling wind forced us to retreat. So please bring sun, rain, wind and cold protection as we can't predict the weather on the day, and Devil's Peak never fails to disappoint with stern weather. Also bring water and snacks. Estimated time up and down is 4 hours. Devil's Peak is very rewarding despite the hard climb- the top feels like a real mountain summit with 360 degree views of Table Mountain, the city bowl, the harbour and Robben Island. wetlands were important, Grade 2s recounted the various threats to wetlands and the Grade 3s voraciously campaigned against the threat of 'aliens'!


