What a way to end an incredible relationship and journey with the WCED! We are so proud of our pupils' performance in the 2023 WCED NSC examinations and so excited for the opportunities that lie ahead for them.

These fine results reflect the phenomenal work ethic at Herschel, the excellent relationship between pupils and teachers and the rich tradition of hard work, holistic participation in school life, impressive time-management skills, and focused engagement.

The Matrics of 2023 have done themselves, their families and Herschel proud!

Our thanks to all Herschel teachers for supporting academic success through their rigorous engagement with the curriculum, passion for their respective subjects, commitment to their pupils and varied approaches to learning. I am so grateful to this team, ably led by Kerri-Lyn East, for their professional and caring input and support in the midst of ongoing change and adaptation. Equally important in supporting this achievement is the layered pastoral support that our pupils receive. The focus on pupil wellbeing and an understanding of how hard it is as times to manage the busyness of school life, provides a realistic context within which to manage and prioritise.

Now, more than ever, as teachers, we have a passion and a purpose and I want to acknowledge and thank this team of teachers for working hard to ensure that we 'finished strong'; and finish strong we have!

As a community we can indeed be proud of the Class of 2023! It is our hope that these young women will continue to advocate, develop, learn and grow as they determine the next chapters in their lives. We hope that they will hold the school tagline close to their hearts and that they will continue to *'learn to make a difference'* wherever they find themselves.

I would like to cite Confidence Dikgole (CEO of the IEB), who makes a very important point regarding the 'cost' of exam pressure: "What, however, is not often talked about is the tremendous pressure brought to bear on learners by society. Schools' experience with young people points to the escalating mental health issues, which is perhaps one of the greatest challenges our youngsters face and does impact their ability to perform at their peak in a high stakes' examination...".

"Mental wellbeing is directly linked to the stress society is placing on our young people to perform, to get top results and secure spots in top tertiary institutions. The competition is huge, and this is a global issue, not just unique to the South African context. Research also points to a correlation between a learner's independence and their overall wellbeing," says Dikgole.

Further on in the press release statement shared with us by the IEB, she goes on to say, "schools are faced with a challenge to grow and nurture confident, courageous, and independent young people — this is directly linked to wellbeing and ultimately their ability to achieve and succeed. This is a journey together with parents, who in the current times have become either not involved or far too protective of their children, sadly to the detriment of their own wellbeing and success. Most of all, we need learners to know that the world of education does not end after Matric, on the contrary, it is the start of a myriad of doors and opportunities."

In my opinion, Confidence Dikgole 'nails it' with regard to the pressure that young people are under to perform and achieve and we need to be intentional in mitigating this through being supportive, role-modelling healthy approaches to time-management and involvement levels, and normalising asking for help. If we can do this, we will be offering the pupils we teach the reassurance that they are not in this alone and that there is support.

And finally, to our Matrics of 2023, as you step out into your next space, remember the profound wisdom in the words of Matthew Haig (*The Comfort Book*):

"Aim to be you!

If you aim to be something you are not, you will always fail. Aim to be you. Aim to look and act and think like you. Embrace that you-ness. Endorse it. Cherish it. Love it."

If you are true to your North, you will develop and grow towards the fullness of who you can be. I have used the lines from *The Velveteen Rabbit* because Williams's words reinforce this notion:

"Once you are Real you can't become unreal again. It lasts for always."

Remember this. It is your agency and your truth. It will stand you in good stead.

Below is the analysis of our matric results, distilled from the individual results supplied to us by the WCED this morning. On a personal note, I would like to thank Kerri-Lyn East (Deputy Academics) and Tracy Rousseau (Deputy Pastoral), both of whom worked hard to provide this analysis of the results for publication today.

We applaud each and every one of our Matrics for their efforts, individually and collectively and we wish them the happiness and success that they so richly deserve.

#### The 2023 results are awe-inspiring and excellent.

## **Highlights include:**

- Of the Class of 2023, which wrote the NSC examinations, 100% passed and they achieved a 100% Bachelor Degree pass.
- The 95 candidates achieved 388 subject distinctions (including Further Studies Mathematics (Standard) and Further Studies English). This equates to an average of 4,1 subject distinctions per candidate.
- 15 pupils attained an aggregate over 90%. (16%) \*
- 48 pupils attained an A aggregate (over 80%). (51%) \*
- In total, 81 pupils attained an A or B aggregate (over 70%). (85%) \*
- 34 pupils achieved 6 or more subject distinctions and 51 pupils achieved 4 or more subject distinctions.
- 10 subjects achieved a subject average of over 80%. These are English, Mathematical Literacy, Accounting, Business Studies, Dramatic Arts, French, Geography, History, Music and Visual Arts. Further Studies Mathematics Standard had an average of 84%.
- We must particularly congratulate the Dramatic Arts and Visual Arts departments for achieving a
  full house of distinctions; French department celebrating 94% distinctions and the Mathematical
  Literacy, Accounting, History and Geography departments are celebrating achieving 70% or more
  distinctions.
