Music Scholarship: Grade 8 – 2027

General Information

VALUE

- The scholarships are worth up to 70% of academic fees.
- Music scholarships also cover music tuition on up to two instruments / voice. The number of and length of lessons, per week, paid for on each of the instruments, is determined by the core syllabus requirements.

ELIGIBILITY

- Candidates currently in Grade 7 wishing to enroll in Grade 8 – 2027 at Herschel, who have achieved a high standard of performance and show potential on any recognised music instrument or voice, are eligible to apply for the scholarship.
- At the audition, it would be advantageous if the level presented (on the first instrument) is a minimum of Grade 3 level or higher. ABRSM, Trinity or UNISA levels are recognised benchmarks, although pieces do not have to come from these syllabi.

SELECTION

Audition Process

- The audition will take place in two rounds:

Round 1 (Video Submission):

- Candidates must submit a video recording of themselves performing **two contrasting pieces** on their main instrument/voice.
- If auditioning on more than one instrument, candidates should perform **one piece on each instrument**.
- Candidates must also **upload copies of the sheet music** for the works performed.
- Based on these submissions, selected candidates will be invited to Round 2.

Round 2 (Live Audition):

- Shortlisted candidates will be required to:
- Perform **three prepared pieces** (the same pieces from **Round 1** plus an additional piece).
- Present a list of **five scales**, OR technical exercises on their first instrument appropriate to the grade level of the repertoire performed.
- Complete a **sight-reading** exercise.
- Complete **basic aural tests**. This will include, but will not be limited to, clapping, and singing back rhythms and melodies.
- Perform a **quick study**, which will be sent by the Music Department 48 hours prior to the audition.
- Write a short **theory assessment (the level of which will not exceed Grade 3)**. This is done to assess the level of theory presented.
- Participate in a short **interview with the panel**.

Final selection will be based on **technical ability, musicality, stylistic awareness, and potential for growth**.

Please note: It will be to the candidate's advantage to present a programme that is securely within their technical ability. Choosing repertoire above their current level, without a confident grasp of the demands, is likely to be disadvantageous.

The successful candidate(s) will be required to take Music as a subject from Grade 8 to Grade 12 and will be expected to be an active and passionate member of the Music Department at Herschel. They will benefit from the scholarship for the remainder of their schooling at Herschel up to Matriculation level.

Music Scholarship Students will be taught by a member of the Herschel full-time or instrumental staff.

Please answer the following questions in complete sentences. There are no right or wrong answers — we want to learn more about who you are, how you think, and what matters to you. Take your time and answer honestly.

1. Can you describe an experience that changed the way you think about things? What happened, and why did it matter to you?

2. Describe a time when you noticed something that felt unfair (at school, sport, or in your community). What happened, and what did you learn about yourself?

3. Tell us about something happening in the world or South Africa that young people should care about. Why does it matter, and what is one small action someone your age could take in response?

4. We are preparing children for a future we cannot fully imagine.

(Sir Ken Robinson, educational thinker)

The world is changing quickly; with new technology, artificial intelligence, and jobs that don't even exist yet. What is one change you think will shape the future for young people, and how do you think someone your age can prepare for it?
